## HERRINGBONE WALL HOW-TO

Add character and warmth to any room with this DIY from Holly and Brad of Our Faux Farmhouse.

## SUPPLIES

$\square$ Safety equipment (including goggles, protective earmuffs, and work gloves)
$\square$ Marking instruments (including a chalk box and pencil)
$\square$ 11/4" 18-gauge nails
$\square$ 45-degree level
$\square$ Tape measure
$\square 48^{\prime \prime} \times 96^{\prime \prime}\left(4^{\prime} \times 8^{\prime}\right)$ sheets of $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$-thick mediumdensity fiberboard (MDF); see step 1 of the instructions to determine quantity
$\square$ Power nailer
$\square$ Miter saw
$\square$ Router (optional; see step 2 of the instructions)
$\square$ Paint, primer, painting tools and supplies


## STEP 1

Measure the width and height of your wall to estimate how many boards you'll need to cover it. For this project, you'll use $6^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime}$ boards. If your wall is $96^{\prime \prime} \times 96^{\prime \prime}$, you'd need approximately sixteen $6^{\prime \prime} \times 96^{\prime \prime}\left(8^{\prime}\right)$ sheets of MDF cut into $48^{\prime \prime}$ lengths.


## STEP 4

Hang the boards with the nailer, starting at the center with full boards. Continue filling in the design with full pieces until you need to custom-cut boards to fit along the borders.

Post a pic and get ready for the likes!
